

8th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C



Jesus said in the Gospel of this 8th Sunday, "You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." None of us wants to be known as a hypocrite for hypocrisy means acting. It's like we are on stage taking on a character that is different from ourselves. Everything we do is only for a show. We have to fake and pretend ourselves like a story about a little boy who was lost at a large shopping mall. "Mommy, Mommy!" the boy cried. An elderly lady saw him and consoled him. "Come

with me," she said, "and I'll buy you an ice cream. Then we will look for your Mommy." A small girl heard this. She approached the boy and whispered, "I know where your Mommy is." "Shh!" the boy whispered her. "I know where she is, too, but I've managed to get two free ice creams this morning, and I want a third!"

That's called hypocrisy. Jesus is strongly against such a sin. He calls us to take off the mask and become our true self. Jesus wants us to know and to be who we are, a sinner that needs repentance. Yes, we are sinners. And that's Ok. Pope Francis once said the church is not a museum of saints but a hospital for sinners. Thinking this way helps us remove the wooden beam in our eye and not pinpointing the splinter in our brother's eye. Meister Eckhart, a great German mystic puts it so well: "You should bother less about what you want to do, and think more about what you want to be because if your being were good then your works would shine forth brightly." That is so true! We cant do good deeds unless our being is good. Jesus in the Gospel said the same thing. He invites us to look at ourselves and cultivate to perfect our being, to remove the wooden beam in our eye first before removing the splinter in our brother's eye. The readings set up a great tone for us to enter Lent. Lent calls us to self- reflect, to be back to the basic to be the best version of ourselfves so that we can go make the difference in the world.

8º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, Año C

Jesús dijo en el Evangelio de este 8º Domingo: "¡Hipócrita! Saca primero la viga de tu ojo, y entonces verás bien para sacar la paja del ojo de tu hermano". Ninguno de nosotros quiere ser conocido como hipócrita, porque la hipocresía significa actuar. Es como si estuviéramos en un escenario asumiendo un personaje que es diferente de nosotros. Todo lo que hacemos es solo para un espectáculo. Tenemos que fingir y simular como en una historia sobre un niño pequeño que se perdió en un gran centro comercial. "¡Mami, mami!", gritó el niño. Una señora mayor lo vio y lo consoló. "Ven conmigo", le dijo, "y te compraré un helado. Luego buscaremos a tu mami". Una niña pequeña escuchó esto. Se acercó al niño y le susurró: "Sé dónde está tu mami". "¡Shh!" el niño le susurró. "Yo también sé dónde está, pero he conseguido dos helados gratis esta mañana, ¡y quiero un tercero!".

Eso se llama hipocresía. Jesús está firmemente en contra de ese pecado. Nos llama a quitarnos la máscara y convertirnos en nuestro verdadero yo. Jesús quiere que conozcamos y seamos quienes somos, un pecador que necesita arrepentimiento. Sí, somos pecadores. Y eso está bien. El Papa Francisco dijo una vez que la iglesia no es un museo de santos sino un hospital para pecadores. Pensar de esta manera nos ayuda a sacar la viga de madera de nuestro ojo y no a señalar la paja en el ojo de nuestro hermano. Meister Eckhart, un gran místico alemán, lo expresa muy bien: "Deberías preocuparte menos por lo que quieres hacer y pensar más en lo que quieres ser porque si tu ser fuera bueno, tus obras brillarían intensamente". ¡Eso es tan cierto! No podemos hacer buenas obras a menos que nuestro ser sea bueno. Jesús en el Evangelio dijo lo mismo. Nos invita a mirarnos a nosotros mismos y a cultivarnos para perfeccionar nuestro ser, a sacar primero la viga de nuestro ojo antes de sacar la paja del ojo de nuestro hermano. Las lecturas nos dan un gran tono para entrar en la Cuaresma. La Cuaresma nos llama a la autoreflexión, a volver a lo básico para ser la mejor versión de nosotros mismos para que podamos hacer la diferencia en el mundo.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5.

Don't forget to fast on this day. 1 big meal only and 2 small meals. And no meat of course.

Welcome to the 2025 Holy Year Jubilee of Hope. As I mentioned in my previous Letter to the Diocese on January 10, 2025 (<u>Letter link here</u>), the Presbyteral Council and I met and have arranged the following churches in our diocese as designated pilgrimage sites on specific days where one may obtain the Holy Year Plenary Indulgence.

1. The Cathedral of Christ the Light, Oakland and Mission San Jose in Fremont are permanently designated sites for each and every day of the Holy Year. Pilgrims may come as individuals, or arrange group pilgrimages with their parish, school, or clubs: Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Knights of Columbus, Confirmation Classes, Divine Mercy, Youth Groups, Legion of Mary, Cursillo & Charismatic Prayer groups, etc.

If you are making a pilgrimage as a group, please contact the Cathedral or Mission San Jose parish offices to make prior arrangements.

2. In order to make the Holy Year pilgrimage indulgence available to as many people as possible, the following churches and chapels in the various regions of the diocese are "Designated Pilgrimage Sites" for one day only:
