



Friends, every year as we come to the end of the year, the church introduces to us the Great Feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph, to remind us of how much family means to our lives. If God needs a family to be raised up, how much do we value the importance of family we have, or are we taking it for granted? We are entering new year, what are your new year resolutions? If not focusing on building up your family relationship, what else is there? Just think of the Holy Family more than 2000 years ago. What was it like to live day in and day out in the household of Joseph? Surely, it was like any other home. The Holy Family didn't be-

come holy automatically. They had to earn their holiness by their endeavors. They would not have been exempt from daily toil, hurt and challenges that face most families. Just think of their flight to Egypt during the night to escape the persecution. They lost Jesus in the temple for three days. Mary saw her son crucified on the cross. God wanted to be born to a family that experienced these hardships, so that no one would feel excluded from the loving tenderness of God. This is significant because it reveals God's love for family life.

The challenge for us is how to keep the fire of love in our family? We live in society where there are too much of push and pulls, of distractions and temptations which easily make our family fall apart. Sometimes, I wonder why there are so many broken families nowadays. Is it because the society that favors divorce or because husband and wife don't take their commitment seriously. They give it up too easily. I know some married couples who break up after twenty, thirty or even forty years of marriage. They together put all effort to build their homes for many years and destroy them in just some moments of anger and conflict.

Family that prays togther is the one that stays together. Some families are strong in virtue, some struggle with basic communication. Some are faithful day in and day out, some are broken and deeply wounded. No matter the case, know that God wants to enter more deeply into your family life just as it is right now. He desires to give you strength and virtue to live as the Holy Family. Surrender yourself and your family, this day, and invite the Triune God to make your family a holy family.

Primer Domingo de Navidad—Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia

Amigos, cada año al llegar al final del año, la iglesia nos presenta la Gran Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia: Jesús, Marí yJosé, para recordarnos cuánto significa la familia en nuestras vidas. Si Dios necesita que se levante una familia, ¿cuánto valoramos la importancia de la familia que tenemos, o la damos por sentado? Estamos entrando en un nuevo año, ¿cuáles son sus resoluciones de año nuevo? Si no se centran en construir su relación familiar, ¿qué más hay? Solo piense en la Sagrada Familia hace más de 2000 años. ¿Cómo era vivir día tras día en la casa de José? Seguramente, era como cualquier otro hogar. La Sagrada Familia no se volvió santa automáticamente. Tuvieron que ganarse su santidad con sus esfuerzos. No habrían estado exentos del trabajo diario, el dolor y los desafíos que enfrentan la mayoría de las familias. Solo piense en su huida a Egipto durante la noche para escapar de la persecución. Perdieron a Jesús en el templo durante tres días. María vio a su hijo crucificado en la cruz. Dios quiso nacer en una familia que experimentara estas dificultades, para que nadie se sintiera excluido de la ternura amorosa de Dios. Esto es significativo porque revela el amor de Dios por la vida familiar.

El desafío para nosotros es ¿cómo mantener el fuego del amor en nuestra familia? Vivimos en una sociedad donde hay demasiados empujones y tirones, distracciones y tentaciones que fácilmente hacen que nuestra familia se desmorone. A veces, me pregunto por qué hay tantas familias rotas hoy en día. ¿Es porque la sociedad favorece el divorcio o porque el esposo y la esposa no toman en serio su compromiso. Lo abandonan demasiado fácilmente? Conozco algunas parejas casadas que se separan después de veinte, treinta o incluso cuarenta años de matrimonio. Juntos pusieron todo el esfuerzo en construir sus hogares durante muchos años y los destruyeron en solo algunos momentos de ira y conflicto.

La familia que ora junta es la que permanece unida. Algunas familias son fuertes en la virtud, algunas luchan con la comunicación básica. Algunas son fieles día tras día, algunas están rotas y profundamente heridas. Sea cual sea el caso, debes saber que Dios quiere entrar más profundamente en tu vida familiar tal como es ahora. Él desea darte fuerza y virtud para vivir como la Sagrada Familia. Entrégate a ti mismo y a tu familia, este día, e invita al Dios Trino a hacer de tu familia una familia santa.

Diaconate Formation Information Meetings

"By ordination, particularly and officially committed to service, the deacon is to inspire, promote and help coordinate the service that the whole Church must undertake in imitation of Christ. He has a special responsibility to identify to the Church those who are in need and particularly those who are without power of voice at the margins of our society. Among such people, the deacon is to speak about Christ and to offer them the Church's varied assistance. But in the Church, he is also to speak about the needy, to articulate their needs, and to inspire and mobilize the whole community's response. He thus becomes a representative figure in whom the Church reaches out to the needy and the needy challenge the Church." (National Conference of Catholic Bishops: Permanent Deacons in the United States – Guidelines on Their Formation and Ministry – 1994 Revision, par 37)

Candidate Qualifications

- Practicing Catholic for 10 years or more.
- Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, and be validly married by the Church, if applicable.
- At least 33 years of age but not older than 60 years of age at the time of application.
- · Good physical and mental health.
- · Gainfully employed or otherwise financially secure.
- Sufficient time to devote to the formation program.
- Demonstrates leadership ability and calling to the social justice ministry of the Church.
- If married, both oral and written support, endorsement and consent of his wife and family. His
 wife should be willing to participate in the formation process.
- · A commitment to celibacy is required of non-married candidates, as well as widowers.
